


# Focus on Stewardship








#### Fiscal Sustainability & Secured Tuition Assistance Programs

For years St. Nicholas and most Catholic schools developed tuition structures far below the cost of education. Dipping into reserves to make the budgets balance was a tried and true strategy for decades; a strategy that is no longer viable. Over the past four years the work of dedicated parents on the Finance Committee and the School Advisory Board led by the administration yielded a new structure that ensures sustainability for the future of St. Nicholas generations.

Along with this new structure comes a commitment to ensure that no family desiring a Catholic education is ever turned away. For the past three years our focus has been on building a tuition assistance program that can serve the next generation of families. Through the generosity of many parishioners and school families we have met our goals and will continue to offer support for all those in need.







#### Proven Academic Performance and Readiness for High School

**Students at St. Nicholas School** continue to show strong and consistent academic achievement year after year. The growth scores each year are closely monitored to ensure that every student advances in their academic knowledge at a level that is better than average and at a rate of a minimum one year. This growth metric is a key indicator of a strong instructional program and culture of learning facilitated by dedicated faculty and staff.

#### Buddy Time: A Treasured Tradition & Part of our Social **Emotional Learning** (SEL) Program

During the first month of every school year, the 8th grade students have their initial Buddy meet-up with our youngest, our TK students. Our oldest mentoring the youngest is a beautiful experience to watch unfold all year long. The first exchange is met with shyness and nerves on both sides. By the second and third exchange this special relationship begins to develop. After our all school morning assembly, the 8th graders will stay back to give their TK buddies a high-five or a quick hug. As the year progresses, these young adolescents who are navigating the challenges of junior high remain the strong nurturers as they step into that TK classroom. Helping to dry tears, cutting paper, reading stories and asking how they are doing all make up the work they do as a big Buddy. Similarly, the other grades are all paired with younger grades, and spend time together throughout the year. A treasured tradition and an SEL experience to help even the quietest introverts develop their social skills.





You pay no capital gains tax on your profit no matter how much the securities have increased in value. The value of your stocks for income tax purposes will be set by the value of the stocks on the day that your gift is made. On actively traded securities, the value is the mean or average between the highest and lowest quoted sales price on the day of your gift.

Class 2007



The children with their wide eyed wonder, excitement and eagerness to learn kept me young at heart!
